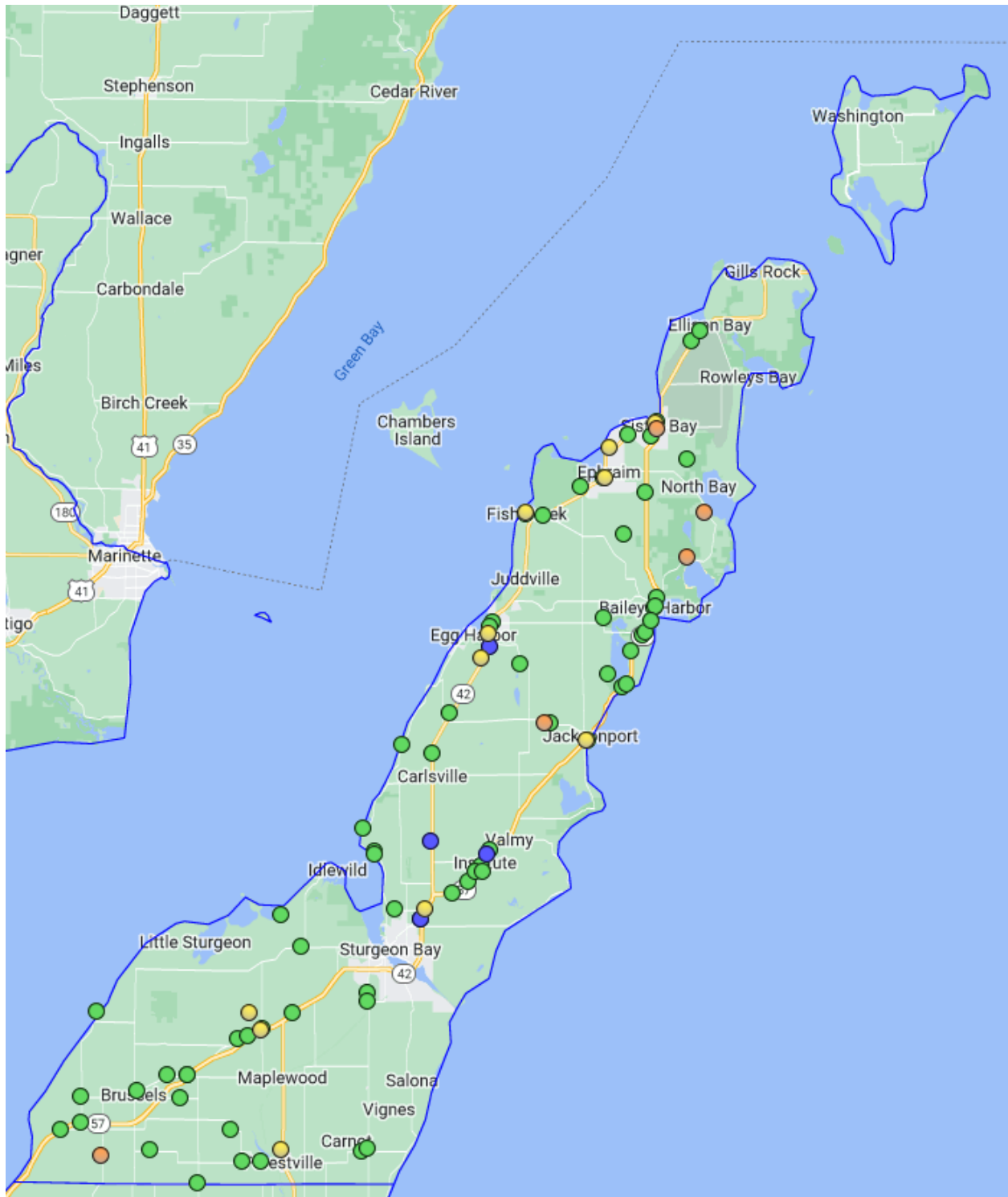
Minutes:

1. **Call to Order – 9:00 a.m.**
Chairman Roy Englebert called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m.
2. **Establish a quorum –** agency representatives in attendance: Roy Englebert, Thad Ash, Brad Shortreed, Jake Holtz, Aaron LeClair, Sean Donohue, Dan Brinkman, Chad Shefchik, David Englebert, Randy Asman, Jenny Austin, and Randy Wiessinger.

Others present: County Board Supervisor Dale Vogel.
3. **Adopt the agenda**
Motion by LeClair, seconded by Ash, to adopt the agenda. Motion carried.
4. **Introduction of guests:** None.
5. **Public Participation:** None.
6. **Correspondence:** None.
7. **Minutes of August 4, 2022 3rd Quarter meeting**
Motion by LeClair, seconded by D. Englebert, to approve the minutes of the August 4, 2022, 3rd quarter meeting. Motion carried.
8. **Pending, continued, “old” business**
 - A. Intersection of CTH H and STH 57 – Update
Randy Asman reported that they have started the design on improvements, with construction in 2026. It will go through the normal public input process.
 - B. Safety Concerns: Intersection of STH 42-57 and CTH BB
Thad Ash reported that he heard back from the WIS DOT. It’s too late to start work this year. In the meantime, the WIS DOT is also applying for a Highway Improvement project (roundabout) for this area, and we will not know the results until spring. When and if we do something, it’s important to do it right. We do not want to create a hazard by trying to fix a hazard. Further discussion held.
 - C. Wild Parsnip Control
Chairman Englebert offered his thanks for the spraying that was done and asked that this be passed along. Ash shared with Sam Koyen in SWCD. Krista at the DOT provided information on where to get additional funding.
9. **New Business:** None.
10. **DOT Update**
Randy Asman said they are trying to emphasize delayed recovery for incidents requiring more than just pulling off the road. They coordinate with county highway departments as to whether to pull out a vehicle right away or wait until after rush times. Delayed recovery can be advantageous to everyone.
11. **BOTS Update (Bureau of Transportation Safety)**
Randy Wiessinger reported that there have been 3 fatalities in the county YTD; and the 5-year average is 4. There have been 488 statewide compared to 520 at this time last year. Statewide there have been 75 motorcycle fatalities YTD, compared to 121 last year. Wiessinger noted that they have developed a Teen Driver Safety PowerPoint, available for download on the TSC site under TSC Resources (Teen Driver Safety Presentation) . They are trying to take a proactive stance. It’s designed for law enforcement or anyone in front of teens. Unfortunately training today is geared to helping teens pass the test; not helping them to make the best decisions. We can only enforce or engineer so much; education is needed. Further discussion held.

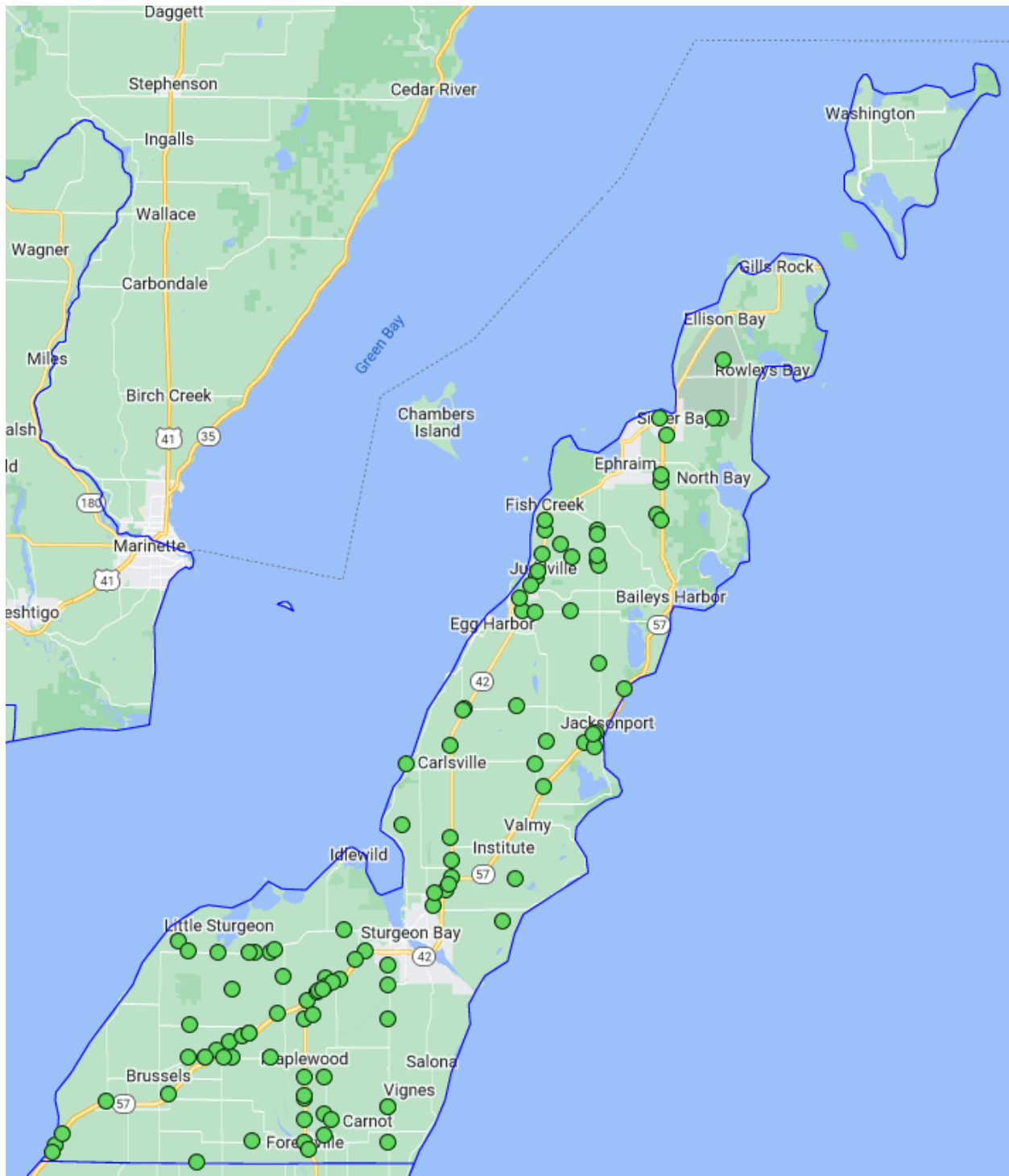
12. **Review of 'Spot Maps'**

 - FYI: Kudo's to Schefchik: The City received a grant to improve safety on CTH S and Duluth for sidewalk, curb & gutter to the Justice Center. It should be done in 2024 or 2025.
 - FYI: Legislation has passed for Green Lights (alternating with amber), for County and Municipal maintenance vehicles. These are very sharp & visible, day or night. Some are being tried out this year. The main thing is to make sure they're only used by those who are allowed to have them.
